


Repair & Restoration

To make our repair and restoration services as easy and client focused as possible, we do not charge upfront and prepare individual quotations for your consideration. All repairs and restorations received will be assessed by our knife smiths to determine effort and associated fees. If you decline your repair or restoration proposal, we can return it unsharpened or sharpen the knife as is for the standard fee.

Repairs


Knife repairs just like sharpening take care and time to keep your knives safe and in use. Small repairs are free as part of our service, but larger repairs will have additional costs. All accepted repair work will be completed on a per knife basis and quoted in a formal proposal. Below is an outline of or repair services.

Edge Repair



Chips in a blade vary in severity and repair is often necessary to keep knives operating safely and efficiently. The only way to repair the blade is to reduce the height of the blade, and create a new edge.

Tip Repair



Creating a new tip requires grinding and removal of metal and the new point will begin where the old tip broke off. That means your knife will be slightly shorter than before. We will propose the most suitable repair, but we are also willing to customize the fix to meet your preference. General tip repairs are as follows:

- 1. Changing the curvature of the top edge of your blade. The end of the top edge will bend down to create a new point and more of the original edge of the blade remains.
- 2. Changing the curvature and 'belly' of the blade and keeping the upper edge intact. This creates a slightly shrunken version of the original.

What we do not repair

- 1. Bent Blades
- 2. Twisted Blades
- 3. Misalignment of Scissor Blades

Restorations

Restorations like repairs are quoted on a per knife basis:

- 1. Discoloring, rust, deep cleaning, polishing
- 2. Blade contouring
- 3. Handle Replacements
